
## Landesign is Now a Weathermatic Premier Partner!

This exciting new partnership allows Landesign to offer the <u>SmartLink</u> <u>Wireless Landscape Network Weather Base Irrigation Control</u> as a subscription, saving our clients the upfront capital expenditure. For a nominal increase in the monthly budget, you will avoid the capital installation cost.

In the past, a conversion to a weather-based controller came with a \$2,500-3,500 per controller capital cost for the hardware, then a \$20/month communication fee. Weathermatic is offering the upgrade to their hardware included in their monthly fee which ranges from only \$40-\$60/month. And for this fee, they guarantee lifetime warranty and hardware upgrades as long as the service is maintained. A small \$600-800 one-time installation cost is required.



As with many technologies today, their innovative new program is 'Subscription-Based' and comes with the hardware with no upfront capital cost. This makes the upgrade to a weather-based controller a no-brainer. Weathermatic SmartLink automatically adjusts irrigation run-times based on your site's DAILY weather activity. Like a Nest Thermostat for your Landscape Irrigation. The typical savings average is 25%+ in water costs. It also provides remote access to the controller via cellular connection, providing the ability to program and monitor from our office or a smartphone or tablet in the field.



We've begun proposing this new offering to replace failing controllers along with our 2021 Irrigation Assessment Reports and will be proposing this conversion to most properties as a part of your 2022 Landscape Budgets. If you want to jump in sooner please **reach out**.
