Poinsettia Facts

The poinsettia is a beautiful, unique flower. Also known as the Christmas Flower, poinsettias have come to be recognized as a staple of the winter season and holidays thanks to their festive shades of red. Many of us are most familiar with the classic look of a red poinsettia, but did you know that they also come in pink, white, marble, and a variety of other colors?





Here are some other fun facts about poinsettias:

- The origins of the poinsettia can be traced back to Mexico.
- The poinsettias we most commonly see are relatively small, but they can actually grow to be between 10 and 15 feet tall when in the right conditions.
- The actual flower of a poinsettia is the bud found directly in the center. Many people think the "petals" that surround this are part of the flower, but they're actually just colorful leaves.
- Poinsettias are susceptible to carbon monoxide exposure. If you notice a
 wilted look, it might be a good idea to check the carbon monoxide levels
 at your property to make sure there isn't a bigger issue.
- It's a common misconception that poinsettias are poisonous. While it's not recommended to ingest poinsettias, it's unlikely that doing so would cause anything more serious than mild irritation.
- Poinsettias thrive when kept in a bright, sunny space with only enough water to remain moist.
- Want to get rid of your poinsettias after the winter season? Consider planting them outdoors! Poinsettias make a great addition to any landscape.
