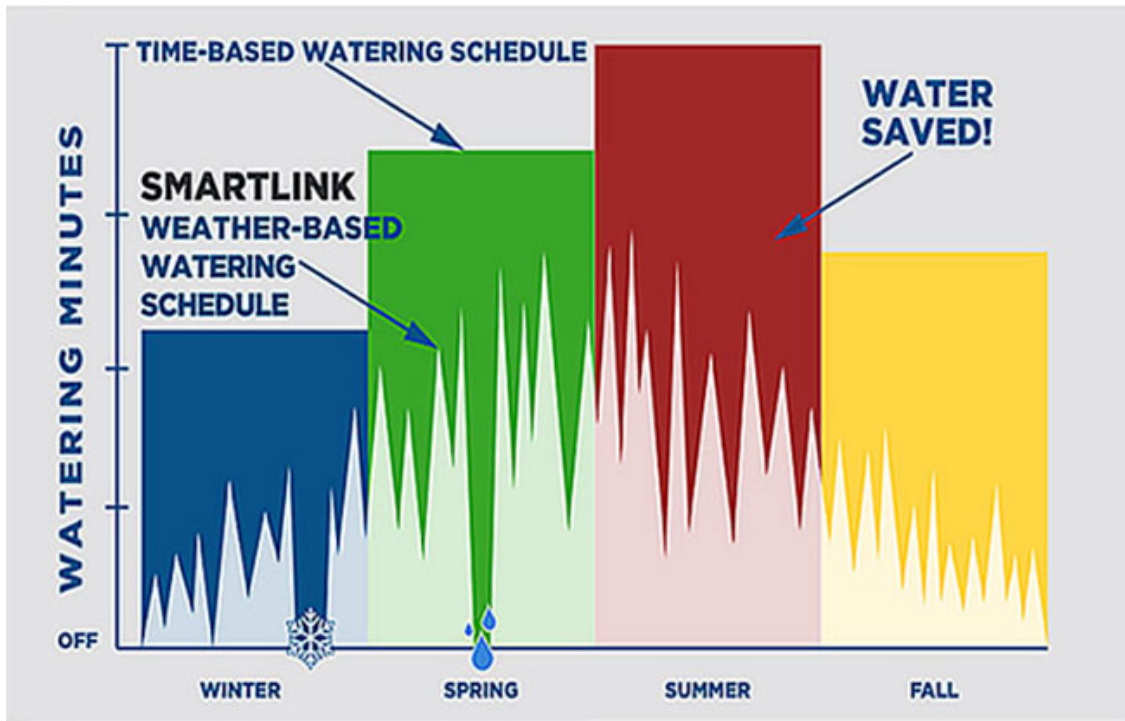
Leader's Message

During Smart Irrigation month and beyond, we're committed to helping our clients obtain a healthy and lush landscape while conserving water. Here are 4 solutions for a more efficient landscape and irrigation system, to minimize operating costs, and preserve the well-being of our environment.

1. Weathermatic Smart Irrigation Controllers: When upgraded to include a weather-station this tech will auto-adjust the watering schedule based on hyper-local weather conditions, eliminating water waste on a 24/7 basis.

If your site already has the Weathermatic controller and AirCard installed (which more than half of our clients do), adding a weather-station is the low-hanging fruit!

This system can be upgraded further with the addition of a flow sensor. This upgrade can instantly notify us of water-wasting issues like stuck valves and other leaks so the affected zones can be turned off immediately and an irrigation tech dispatched to make the repair.



2. Nozzle Retrofits: Upgrade to high-efficiency nozzles and rotators. Converting existing sprays to MP Rotators can result in a water reduction of 30%.

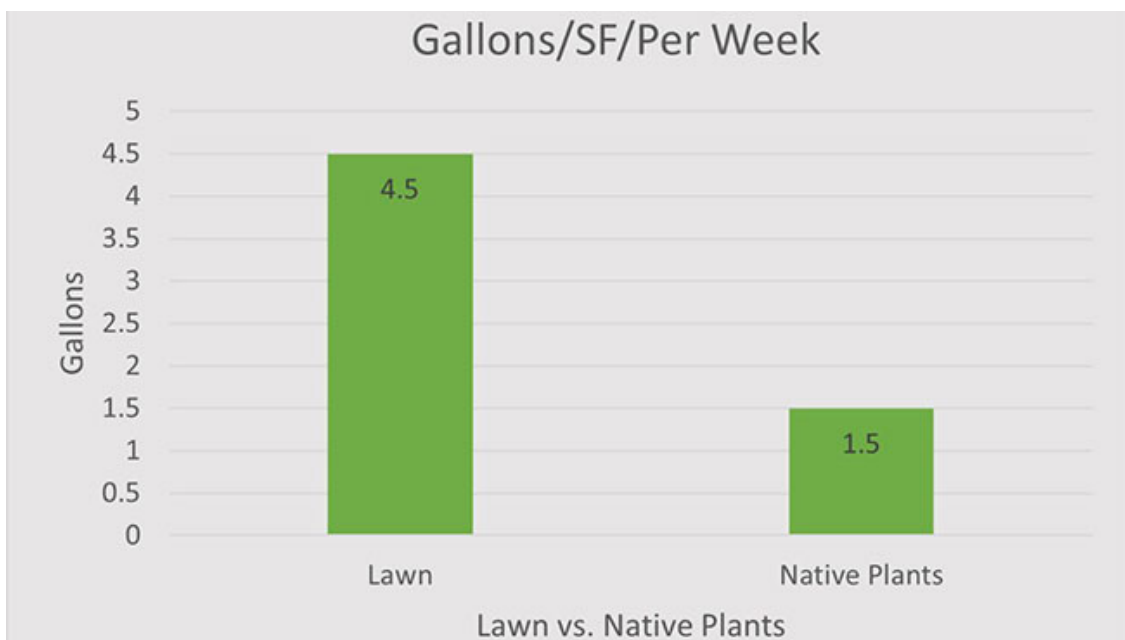
MP Rotators Spray



3. Valve Conversions: Replace sprinklers with drip irrigation to deliver water directly to plant roots. Minimizes water waste due to wind, runoff, evaporation, and overspray.



4. Turf Reduction: Remove and replace turf with native plants. In the graph below, you will see just how large the discrepancy is in water usage between lawns and native plants.
